Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

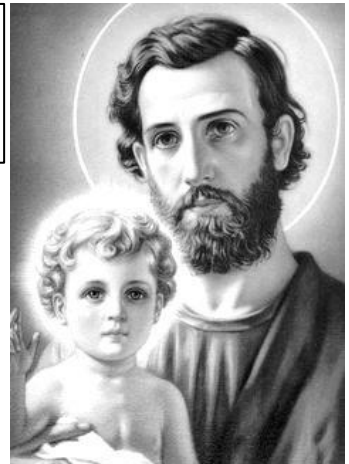
On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII promulgated the Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* and declared ex-cathedra the dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. *"By the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory"* In many of the Eastern Catholic Churches the feast of the Assumption is known as "the Dormition of Mary and this belief has been held since the early church in both the east and the west.

In most of the world, including the United States it is a holy day of Obligation.
